Introduction

Welcome back to IN THE ZONE — live from The WrestleZone at Universal Studios: Orlando!

John Phillips: Good evening, everyone! I'm John Phillips, and joining me as always is Mark Bravo.

Aaron Shaffer vs. Angel Perez
